Public Policy Update

Activity on Capitol Hill is impacting issues critical for AAUW policy.

The Dream Act

President Trump had ordered an end to the Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) program implemented by the Obama administration in 2012. The program had provided 800,000 recipients

the ability to attend school and work without fear of deportation. Note: Changes regarding the Act are occurring as you read. More than 40 lobby corps members brought AAUW's message to Representatives on September 14.

On behalf of AAUW members and supporters, lobby corps members urged the representatives to pass a 'clean' Dream Act (with no amendments), a bipartisan bill that would provide undocumented young individuals conditional permanent residents status for eight years if: they have been here four years prior to the enactment of the Act; entered the US before the age of 18; earned a high school diploma, or have been admitted to an institution of higher education; have not been convicted of a crime; and have passed required security and background checks. In 2015, 51 percent of all DACA applicants were women most of whom were working and contributing to our economy.

Title IX

Secretary of Education Betsy DeVos announced the **intention to rescind a letter on Title IX and sexual violence**, taking the first step to roll back the progress made toward preventing sexual violence in our schools. AAUW stands with the survivors of campus sexual violence, and remains committed to protecting and defending Title IX and to pursuing vigorous enforcement.
