### Public Policy: Struggles and Results — Not All Good

#### Federal

Congress needs to pass a funding bill by Dec. 11. AAUW and its coalition members continue to urge the Congress to promote education and economic security, opposing cuts to the Pell grant program; defend civil rights urging the protection of Violence Against Women Act; protect women's health by supporting funding for the Title X family planning program; and reject ideological riders that threaten the strength of the budget agreement and risk government shutdown.

#### Virginia

In two months the Virginia General Assembly will gather for its 60-day even-year session. Although it will focus on adopting the biennial budget, there are issues important to Northern Virginia. The General Assembly will look a lot like its 2015 predecessor, as the Nov. 3rd elections resulted in no change in the composition of the state senate (21-19) and a gain of one seat for the Democrats in the House of Delegates (34 out of 100 seats).

The branch recently learned that Shirley Tennyson died at her home in Vienna, Virginia, on Jan. 23, 2015. She was a long time branch member and an AAUW life member, originally joining in 1954. She graduated from the Carnegie Institute of Technology (now Carnegie Mellon). She married in 1944, and during WWII she worked at a Westinghouse lab in Bloomfield, New Jersey, unaware until the end of World War II that her work was for the Manhattan Project.

She was active in her church, Kappa Kappa Gamma sorority, AAUW, Girl Scouting, and playing and teaching tennis. She is survived by her sister, three daughters, and three grand-children.
