Membership Dues Increase

The AAUW Board of Directors voted in June 2017 to enact the first dues change in almost a decade. Effective March 16, 2018, national dues will increase from \$49 to \$59. As a result, our dues including national, state, and branch will be \$85.00. Of the national dues, \$56 is tax deductible.

Annual dues currently **account for 13 percent of AAUW**'s **annual budget.** It helps to sustain and grow AAUW's programs and work that advances equity for women and girls. A combination of dues, donations, and corporate and foundation funding is critical to support AAUW's <u>salary negotiation workshops</u>, groundbreaking <u>research</u> and <u>advocacy</u> efforts, <u>campus leadership programs</u>, and so much more.

Checks should be made out to McLean Area Branch AAUW.

Annual Used Book Sale

This year's Annual Used Book Sale is at **Spring Hill Recreation Center** on **August 31-September 2**, with setup on August 30. **Sorting** will continue at the **Sun Trust Bank** in Vienna, where we have already received more than 300 boxes of books. Sorting will begin on **Thursday, April 19**. **Saturday collections** will be on **May 12**, **June 2**, **June 23**, and **July 14**. **Diane Alden** is **recruiting member volunteers** to staff the collections. Please help. If you are available, **call Diane** at **703-356-7452**. Students will be hired to do the heavy lifting.

Besides collecting and sorting there are a few areas that still need leadership:

Category Leaders: decide what should be kept in a given category, price books that are more valuable, and box the books. Information sessions on pricing and how to streamline the process are being scheduled.

Book Sale Signs: help update current sale site signs and create new ones as needed.

Volunteer Recruitment: solicit member volunteers for the sale. A template to work from is provided.

Office Manager: oversee member and volunteer sign in during the sale, and collect presale payments (i.e., books purchased by members during sorting).

Box Acquisition: get boxes and deliver to the bank. Good sources are Total Wine on Tuesdays or Wednesdays and grocery stores for fruit flats (at least the depth of a paperback).

Don't Delete That eMail

AAUW members received an important email on February 22 from the National Board of Directors that presented three important proposed AAUW Bylaws amendments that must to be voted on this spring. You have UNTIL MARCH 22 to (a) comment on the proposals, (b) amend them, and/or (c) propose you own amendment to anything in the AAUW Bylaws.


The **proposed amendments** are:

- 1. Change the structure of the national board to staggered three-year terms, beginning with elections in 2019 (the primary reason for voting this year on amendments is to put this in place).
- 2. Delete the requirement that national board members must be AAUW members. The board composition of 15 must have at least 10 AAUW members, so no more than five can be non-members. Non-members could serve in all board positions, including board chair.
- 3. Delete the degree requirement, opening membership to all who support our mission.

The **AAUW** website has a thorough explanation of the rationale for each of the proposed amendments. **As members**, it is important to review the proposed amendments, comment or amend. Consider if there are other places in the AAUW Bylaws where you want to submit an amendment. **VOTE between April 25 and June 9** (May 21 for paper ballots). **If** you **submit an amendment**, **follow** the **instructions** carefully. **If** you **comment** on a proposed amendment, type your comment **in the "Comment" box**.
