## McLean Branch 50th Anniversary

#### And So, We Began

- On February 27, 1969, a small group gathered at Elaine Weed's home, along with Virginia AAUW State President Adelaide Stegman of the Arlington Branch, and decided to form a new branch of AAUW.
- The **original name was McLean-Vienna, VA Branch**, but the following April that was changed to our current name, McLean Area Branch.
- Branch dues was set for \$15 (an astounding \$104.17 in 2018 dollars).
- On May 9, the AAUW Board of Directors officially recognized the branch with 35 charter members. Elaine Weed was the first president.
- Two charter members are still in the branch, Mary Ann Curry (2nd president) and Carol Langelier (3rd president). Mary Ann, who is in her 90's, is a dual member and lives in Florida.
- At the end of the branch's first full year, there were 50 members, including current members Trianthe Dakolias and Fran Pearce. All the members were listed in the directory by their married name, followed by their maiden name in parentheses. So, Carol was Mrs. Robert M. Langelier (Carol Ann Milioti; Purdue).
- By April of that first year, the branch held its first book sale at the Maytime Gift Shop in McLean, 4-9 pm on Friday and 9 am-4 pm on Saturday. Members used scissors and twine to tie books together for the buyers. The contribution to the AAUW Foundation was \$100.
- Branch meetings were held at Churchill Road School, at 8 pm, on the third Thursday of the month. Programs included "The Third Pollution" (a film on solid waste), Educational Trends in our Academic Community, Power--the Capacity to Act, and A Capsule View of My Life as a Senator's Wife (Mrs. Jack Miller of Iowa). This Beleaguered Earth was the nation-wide AAUW topic, focusing on the environment.
- The branch began to grow and prosper.

## Public Policy Update Your Lobby Corps at Work

On **September 6**, **30 AAUW members** of the Lobby Corps **met** in the Dirksen Building cafeteria on Capitol Hill. **Pamela Yuen**,

Public Policy staff member, briefed the gathering on the message of the day. The members visited the offices of all the Senate members, except for three, and **delivered this message**:

After careful review of Judge Kavanaugh's available record, AAUW has concerns he will do grave harm by undermining positions central to AAUW's mission, including upending employment and labor rights, opposing reproductive rights and access to health care, entangling public education and religion, and restricting voting rights. We urge the Senators to oppose Judge Brett Kavanaugh's confirmation to the Supreme Court.

On **Thursday, September 27, 36 AAUW members**, including 10 members lobbying for the day from Virginia, **visited 97 Senate offices with the same message** and **letter from AAUW public policy officers**.

Judge Kavanaugh was confirmed for the Supreme Court by a vote of **50 to 48**.
