The Branch also supports the recognition of junior year high school girls who have demonstrated outstanding achievements in STEM. The students recognized are from McLean local high schools.

Funds raised at the 50th annual Mclean AAUW Used Book Sale will be used to support these valuable programs and initiatives. McLean Area Branch's 2019-2020 Fellowship and Grant Recipients

Through the years our Branch contributions to AAUW Funds endowed an American Fellowship and an International Fellowship. Each of the Fellowships required a total contribution of \$100,000. Those were followed in subsequent years by two Research & Projects Grant endowments, the Career Development for women pursuing a new career or completing one and the Community Action for projects. These four awards are made annually to women, making it possible for the recipients to complete their education (American, International, Career Development) or for an individual or a branch to create and fund a project benefitting girls (Community Action).

This year's recipients are:

<u>American Fellowship</u>- Kristal Brown, Virginia Commonwealth University, PhD, "The Role of Perceived Racial Discrimination in Obesity and Cardiovascular Treatment among African-American Women."

International Fellowship- Singuila Shimra (India), George Mason University, PhD in Peace Building and Conflict Resolution, "Women's Influence in Peace Talks and Processes."

<u>Career Development Grant</u>- <u>Monica Kimaro</u>, Stratford University, BS in Nursing to obtain her RN. Kimaro is a single mother of 2 children.

<u>Community Action Grant "Rosie Riveters"</u> - <u>Brittany Greer</u> project chair, Fairfax Community Center after-school and summer program, STEM lessons and activities for girls ages 4-14.

ERA Update

VAratifyERA, a nonpartisan campaign and #iScream4Equality, an education/outreach effort are working hard to get out the vote for the November 5 state elections in support of Virginia's ratification of the ERA, which lacked one vote during last year's legislative session. The #iScream4Equality tour will spend its time in targeted districts

with stops at community events, high school and college/university/trade campuses, and womenowned businesses.

AAUW's New Focus on Negotiations

AAUW has partnered with the New York City Economic Development Corporation to teach 10,000 women in the Big Apple how to negotiate for higher salaries and advocate for themselves at work. The initiative, "Ask for More," includes online training; and starting in the fall, a series of workshops in the city's five boroughs. Plans are also underway to develop Spanish language training and programs tailored to specific industries.

Congress Back in Session

Many critical bills are waiting to be considered, voted out of committees, and onto the Senate and House floors. The AAUW Capitol Lobby Corps will assist the AAUW Public Policy staff by bringing messages to Capitol Hill this fall.
