STEM Essay Contest Winners

The winners of the 2020 STEM Essay Contest sponsored by the McLean Area Branch have been selected and notified. The contest was open to 7th and 8th grade students (girls and boys) at local public and private schools. The students were asked to discover and publicize a woman who made a difference in Science, Technology, Engineering, or Mathematics, who was not recognized in her lifetime, discussing why she was selected and the impact of her STEM contribution.

The winners of the contest are:

- 1st Place: **Anna Wisniewski**, Cooper Middle School (7th Grade)
- 2nd Place: **Laura Zhang**, Longfellow Middle School (8th Grade)
- Honorable Mention: **Katharine Kanner-Bitetti**, The Potomac School (8th Grade)
- Honorable Mention: **Fay Moran**, Cooper Middle School (7th Grade)

The students and a parent had been invited to the May luncheon. Instead, we are exploring the possibility of holding a June event. Awards will be presented to the winners at that time. **Anna Wisniewski**, first place winner, wrote her essay on **Hedy Lamarr**, film actress and a pioneer in frequency-hopping technology that made spread-spectrum systems possible. Other women who were the subjects of the winning essays are **Lise Meitner**, a researcher who played a critical role in the discovery of nuclear fission; **Arda Green**, a biochemist who was part of the team that isolated serotonin; and **Florence Nightingale**, a nurse who is less known for her revolutionary use of statistics to prevent deaths by analyzing army hospital records.

Fourteen volunteers from our Branch served as judges: Pam Bacher, Marie Briones-Jones, Marlene Chivavibul, Dorothy Hassan, Myrtle Hendricks-Corrales, Sherry Joslin, Mary Lou Melley, Nina McVeigh, Tom McVeigh, Judy Page, Caroline Pickens, Betsy Schroeder, Barbara Sipe, and Adarsh Trehan. The essay contest was managed by a steering committee, consisting of Marlene Chivavibul, Myrtle Hendricks-Corrales, and Betsy Schroeder, together with Judy Page, STEM Chair.

News of the closing days of the legislative session in Richmond used such words as frenzied and 'barreling toward the end." Some of the results include-

Gerrymandering: The Commonwealth is moving to amend the state constitution to create a first-ever redistricting commission that will include

citizens, enshrine protections of the Voting Rights Act, and require full transparency of the commission's meetings. Voters will have the final say on November's ballot when they vote on the proposal which will amend the Commonwealth's constitution.

Other Virginia Assembly session results include: a raise for public school teachers; in-state tuition freeze at public colleges; an increase in in-state financial aid; gun violence prevention and intervention; investment in and modernization of Virginia's transportation system; an expansion of early childhood education; allowing early voting for any reason; and raising Virginia's minimum wage.

AAUW and the Coronavirus Impact

Kim Churches, AAUW CEO, announced that the national office is closed through March 27. All employees are in mandatory telework status. Many related conferences are cancelled or postponed. However, planning for the National Conference for College Women Student Leaders (NCCWSL) continues, since it will take place at the end of May.

AAUW has long worked toward paid family and medical leave, supporting the legislation approved by the House of representatives as well as the Healthy Families Act. Nearly one-third of the workforce lack access to paid sick days. Women, who often are primary caregiver, are especially impacted. The current pandemic illustrates the need for paid sick leave.

Kate Neilson is now the AAUW staff person in charge of public policy. Volunteer lobbying is on hold.
