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Presidents' Message

Because the 2020 McLean Branch Book Sale has been cancelled, the Branch board developed book sale fundraising alternatives. One effort is the letter you recently received asking for donations. Why We Support AAUW Funds

Branch policy is to give 50% of book sale proceeds to AAUW Funds. A question that arises, especially among newer members is, "What are AAUW Funds and why do we give to them?" The following is an adaptation of an earlier article by Branch member **Nancy Richardson**, who has 36 years of experience with our book sales. **Nancy** has served many times as chair and twice as Branch president.

Many members think local scholarships and awards provide more visible community outreach. It also gives the Branch more control over use of the money it raises to inspire young girls, and give women in need the financial support that enables them to return to college to complete their degrees.

Others point out that McLean Area Branch has contributed more than most at the national level. The Branch has supported AAUW research into learning and has built four AAUW ongoing endowments that support post-graduate education for women. It has long been felt that AAUW's support for post-graduate education is a strong driver of systemic change because the women selected to receive funds are among the best and the brightest, whose future work may significantly impact millions of people.

The work of AAUW includes support for female college educators justifiably seeking but denied tenure, redress for discrimination, and justice in sexual harassment cases. Often women are not able to stand up alone against a college or university's money and power. Recently AAUW expanded this support to women in the workplace. McLean Branch has regularly contributed funds for this work as well.

AAUW also has a series of far-reaching projects aimed at young women, such as those focusing on STEM education, landing a good job, negotiating fair pay, learning how to run for office, and more. What a boost for this population!

Our Branch is not independent of AAUW. We subscribe to the organization's mission, goals, and efforts to support women and girls. Without AAUW we would simply be a small group with relatively little clout and no ability to help women and girls at the national level. Through its extensive network, trusted national reputation (especially on Capitol Hill), and multiple diverse efforts to support women and girls, AAUW gives our Branch life, and a highly respected one at that.

Let us continue to support the many talented women and girls who've come before our Branch and wowed us with their determination and accomplishments. Let's never forget the true source of our widest reach to ensure the greatest success for women, AAUW.

2020 Fundraising Initiatives

A committee is working to find alternate ways to raise money in lieu of our annual book sale. All funds raised will go to AAUW Funds and our local scholarships program, as stated in our Branch policies (50/50). More information will be coming as new fundraising ideas are developed. We do not anticipate to raise the same level of funds that was earned from our most recent book sales. We feel, however, that these efforts will allow us to raise money to continue our mission of supporting women and girls in all aspects of equal opportunity.

zoom Tips And Reminders

All branch in-person meetings and activities are occurring on **ZOOM**. It is user friendly. Below are some tips/reminders on using **ZOOM** when you receive the email invitation to join a meeting or activity.

1. To join the video chat, click on the provided link and, when prompted, indicate that you want to join with computer audio. The meeting number and password are provided in the link. Type in when indicated to do so.
2. You might be asked to download the free **ZOOM** software—please say yes (this is often the case the *first* time you log on with an I-phone or Android).
3. If for some reason you are not able to join with video, you can dial into the call and experience it as if it were a conference call. We will be able to hear you so feel free to speak up (and mute when not speaking).
4. The “controls” for your experience can generally be found by touching the screen or hovering your mouse around the outer edge—and they appear as a banner with options like mute through the image that looks like a microphone; similarly, the camera image turns video on/off (though video usually happens automatically).
5. When a person speaks, there will be a yellow border around the speaker's screen; please consider muting yourself if not speaking (but don't forget to un-mute so we can hear you when you wish to speak).
6. Please look for the option (around the edge of the screen) “Gallery View” so that you can see who's joined the session; the other option is “Speaker View” where you will see your image and just the person who is speaking.

We look for to seeing you at **ZOOM** meetings.

High School STEM Awards Recipients Announced

Four female students have been selected as the recipients of the Branch's Science and Math Achievement Awards for 2020. For the past seven years, the McLean Area Branch has partnered with counselors at local high schools to give these achievement awards to female students finishing their junior year. Each award consists of a certificate and a \$100 check. The Branch instituted the awards to encourage young women to pursue educational opportunities related to STEM.

The awards criteria include a demonstrated record of overall academic success and a distinguished record of achievement in either math or science. Career center counselors at the schools manage the process of selecting the students. The following students received the 2020 awards:

Plan Ahead for November Voting

The Virginia General Assembly recently passed measures to make voting easier in the State. Some of these include absentee voting that doesn't require an explanation, the expansion of accepted IDs, a state holiday on election day, automatic voter registration, high school voter registration and same day voter registration, and improvement in the absentee voter process.

Important dates to remember:

November General Election: November 3, 2020

Early walk-in voting begins (locations vary): September 19, 2020

Deadline to register to vote: October 13, 2020

Deadline to request absentee ballot by mail: October 27, 2020

Early walk-in voting ends: October 31, 2020



To vote by absentee ballot, go to vote.elections.virginia.gov and the citizens portal. Identify yourself to verify your voter registration information and to either update the information or obtain an absentee ballot.

AAUW-Virginia Public Policy chairs expressed support for voting by mail and other measures to make voting easier. We continue to support get-out-the-vote measures and coordinate with the League of Women Voters of Virginia.

Virginia – Effects of Covid-19

Virginia Senator **Janet Howell** wrote that it was heart-breaking to realize that all the progress the State had made in funding teachers' pay, early education, human services, economic development, and climate change vanished. Eighty budget items were placed in a bloc with the designation 'un-allotted' because of the pandemic's impact on the budget.

AAUW Lobby Corps

Kate Neilson, Director of Public Policy, hosted a **ZOOM** session with past and current chairs of the Lobby corps. **Letty Bustillos**, the new Federal Policy Manager, will be coordinating the Lobby Corps. She held a **ZOOM** session for all lobbyists on May 21 and discussions included training and operations, with an emphasis on grass roots activities and webinars. Given the constraints of traveling to the Hill, the Corps will examine opportunities for alternative ways to impact legislation.
