Welcome new members to our Branch

Deborah B. Leiderman

Deborah Leiderman is a retired physician and neurologist who does consulting and volunteer work part-time. She earned a BA in Anthropology from Harvard-Radcliffe College, and an MD and MA in History and Sociology of Medicine from the University of Pennsylvania. She completed her residency at Stanford University School of Medicine and spent two years practicing general medicine and neurology on the Navajo reservation in Arizona serving in the Indian Health Service.

She then moved to the DMV - Bethesda Maryland - for what was intended to be a two-year Fellowship at NIH. However, she continued on staff at NIH doing clinical research in two different Institutes. **Deborah's** husband, a career research geologist with the US Geological Survey (USGS) on the west coast followed her east for an AAAS Congressional Fellowship in science policy joining the USGS in Reston. Career moves took their family to Ann Arbor for three years after which they returned to the DMV for dual career reasons, landing in Falls Church/ McLean.

Deborah's passions include birdwatching, nature walks, travel, books, social justice, and health care equity. She has volunteered in several local free clinics and worked on homelessness and hypothermia shelters within her congregation and through a county-wide faith community. Her greatest concerns now are the erosion of democracy and individual civil liberties, for the undermining of women's right to control our bodies as well as for the attacks on physicians and scientists, librarians, and teachers on science, data, and truth.

Anita Nahal

Anita Nahal is a professor, poet, flash fictionist, children's writer, and editor. She has authored 13 books: three of poetry, one of flash fictions, four for children, and four edited poetry anthologies. Anita's fourth poetry book and a fifth edited anthology are due out this year. Her poems and stories can be found in national and international journals and anthologies in the US, UK, Asia, and Australia. Nahal's poems are also housed at Stanford University's Digital Humanities initiative. Anita received a BA and MA in History, an MPhil in American Studies from Delhi University, and a PhD in American Studies from Jawaharlal Nehru University. Besides writing full time, Nahal continues to teach. She is currently an Adjunct Professor at the University of the District of Columbia, Washington DC. Anita has previously been a member of the Arlington, VA, and the Virtual Empire State AAUW Branches. She has also served on the AAUW National Task Force on Diversity & Inclusion. Originally from New Delhi, India, Anita now resides in McLean. Her family includes her son, daughter-in-law, and a golden doodle.

Shop Online and Raise Funds for the Branch



Our Branch has initiated a **new fundraiser** in support of scholarships, awards, and programs. We have established a partnership with ShopRaise. It is a simple way to turn everyday shopping at more than 1,000 participating retailers into support for the Branch. ShopRaise works with more than 700 nonprofits, schools, and clubs from Susan G. Komen to elementary schools, including several other AAUW branches.

By using the ShopRaise portal when beginning online purchases, a percentage of everything you buy - from groceries and apparel to technology and travel – is donated to our Branch. Some of the stores included are **Macy's**, **L. L. Bean**, **Bed Bath & Beyond**, **Lowes**, **Home Depot**, **Walgreens**, **Walmart**, **and Staples**. ShopRaise does not collect any credit card information but serves as a gateway to the merchant websites where you would normally shop.

You can **set up your account on your phone or tablet** by going to the Apple App Store or Google Play Store and searching for "ShopRaise." Download the app and either create a ShopRaise account with an email address and password of your choice or login with your Google (gmail) or Facebook accounts. Then locate our Branch as the cause you are supporting by clicking on "Charity NPO" and searching for AAUW. Our Branch will appear in the Results.

If you enjoy **shopping on your computer**, you can set up your account by clicking on our "landing page" located at <u>https://shopraise.com/go/3MM</u>. Click on "**Get the App**" where you create an account with your email address and a password, or you can login with your Google (gmail) or Facebook account. Once you login, you should see your name in the upper right-hand corner. Put your cursor over your name to see a drop-down menu where you can start to Shop.

Bylaws Update

Proposed McLean Area Branch Bylaws Amendments

Branch members will be asked at the **November 15 Branch meeting** to approve three amendments to Branch Bylaws. A 2/3 vote is required for passage, so it is important for members to attend this meeting.

Amendment #1:

Article VI. Financial Administration. Section 5. Increases in Spending.

Current wording: The Board of Directors may approve increases in total spending above the operating budget up to \$150. Increases that exceed \$150 shall be approved by the members. **Proposed amendment:** The Board of Directors may approve increases in total spending above the operating budget up to \$500. Increases that exceed \$500 shall be approved by the members.

Rationale: The \$150 amount dates back many years. Increasing it to \$500 will give the Board more flexibility and is a more current and reasonable figure.

Amendment #2:

Article VIII. Elected Officers. Section 1. Elected Officers.

Current wording: The elected officers shall be a president(s), vice president(s) of program, vice president(s) of membership, secretary(s) and treasurer.

Proposed amendment: Amend "treasurer" to "treasurer(s)"

Rationale: The position of treasurer has become increasingly time-consuming and difficult for one person to do everything regarding Branch finance, member renewals, and new member registration. The work on member renewals and registration has especially increased. Allowing a co-treasurer will spread the work. Note: if this amendment is adopted, all other references to "treasurer" in the Bylaws will be revised to "treasurer(s)."

Amendment #3:

Article IX. Board of Directors. Section 1. Membership. b.

Current wording: The current wording lists the appointed positions on the Branch Board. It includes one position no longer on the Board (publicity chair, which is now under the communications chair) and some positions that are on the Board but not listed. Current positions that will remain are AAUW Funds, communications, and public policy.

Proposed amendment: Delete "publicity chair" and add the following: bylaws chair(s); DE&I chair(s); fundraising chair(s); and STEM chair(s). Section 1.b. will then read "the Affiliate members appointed to the following positions: AAUW Funds chair(s); bylaws chair(s); communications chair(s); DE&I chair(s); fundraising chair(s); public policy chair(s); STEM chair(s); and others as appointed by the president(s)."

Rationale: This amendment will bring the list of Board members up to date.

Election 2022--What You Need to Know

• Any registered Fairfax County voter may vote early at any Fairfax County early voting location. In-person early voting is available for the **November 8, 2022,** General Election.



- If you received a ballot in the mail, you must bring it with you and surrender it to vote in person
- Curbside voting is available for eligible voters
- Drop boxes are available during satellite operating hours
- Voter Identification: All voters casting a ballot in-person must show one form of identification. Any voter who does not present acceptable identification may instead sign a statement, subject to felony penalties, that they are the named registered voter who they claim to be. Any voter who does not present acceptable identification or sign this statement must vote a provisional ballot.
- For a link to acceptable voter identification, please click
- **Absentee voting:** All registered voters can vote absentee by mail in November's general election. You will need to apply to do so and you will need a witness signature on your absentee ballot.
- In-person voting on Election Day: The general election is Tuesday, November 8, 6 am to 7 pm.
