IMPORTANT DATES

- **Voter Registration Deadline: October 16 for absentee ballots**
 - 11:59 p.m. online, or postmarked by mail October 16
 - Register online using the Virginia Department of Elections [Citizen portal](#)
 - [Download a voter registration application](#)
- **Absentee Ballots will be mailed: September 22**
- **Last Day to Request an Absentee Ballot: October 27 by 5 p.m.**
 - This deadline applies to both online submissions *and* in-person submissions.
 - Visit [Vote by Mail](#) for more information
- **Deadline for Return of Vote by Mail Ballots:**
 - November 7 by 7 p.m. if hand-delivered in-person
 - Postmarked on or before November 7 and received by noon on November 14 if by-mail (due to Veterans Day holiday)
- **Early Voting In-Person: Begins September 22, ends November 4, 2023.**

What's On the Ballot:

- State offices: Senator, House of Delegates member, Commonwealth's attorney
- County offices: Board of Supervisors Chairman and members, clerk of the court, sheriff, School Board members, Soil and Water Conservation District members.

What You Need to Know:

- **Any registered Fairfax County voter** may vote early at any Fairfax County early voting location
- In-person early voting is available for the **November 7, 2023 Virginia Elections**
- **If you received a ballot in the mail**, you must bring it with you and surrender it to vote in person
- **Curbside voting** is available for [eligible voters](#)
- **Droboxes** are available during satellite operating hours
- **Voter Identification** All voters casting a ballot in-person will be asked to show one form of identification. Any voter who does not present acceptable identification may instead sign a statement, subject to felony penalties, that they are the named registered voter who they claim to be. Any voter who does not present acceptable identification or sign this statement must vote a provisional ballot.

(5) Support adequate and equitable funding for quality K-12 public education and opposes diversion of public funds for nonpublic schools?
