For more than 130 years, AAUW members have examined and taken poaitions on fundamental issues like educational and economic equity, public policy and activism regarding women's issues. Our commitment to our mission is reflected in all aspects of our work.

# Education and Advocacy

Each year the branch has a fund raiser(s). The money earned is dedicated to scholarships for women and to other AAUW missions. More information is available on our website.

The proceeds go to fellowships and scholarships for women, AAUW's Legal Advocacy Fund and leadership development in the branch. Additionally, for many years we have funded scholarships for exceptional women returning to college at Bennett College in North Carolina and Trinity University in Washington DC.

We also partner with schools in our local community to encourage young women and girls to pursue educational opportunities related to STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math). Some of these activities include presenting an engineering award from the Fairfax County Regional Science Fair for high schools, a middle school essay contest on women in STEM, and presenting achievement awards in math, science, and computer science to female high school juniors in four of our local high schools.

Our branch works with AAUW of Virginia and the AAUW Action Fund Capitol Hill Lobby Corps to advocate for legislative issues affecting women and girls. We support the AAUW Legal Advocacy Fund, which supports women seeking judicial redress for gender discrimination in higher education and in the workplace.

# Lifelong Learning

Our monthly programs (September thru May) feature recognized speakers and panelists who provide the latest information and insight on a wide variety of subjects of interest to AAUW members. Meetings are generally held on the third Tuesday of the month at 7:30 p.m. or the third Saturday at 10:00 a.m. at the McLean Community Center, 1234 Ingleside Avenue when it is available. In addition to regular branch programs, we gather for a holiday luncheon in December and a branch celebration luncheon in May. All meetings are open to the public. Please join us.
